

## ENFORCEMENT NOW

Mr. Henry Eng, Director of the DPP, has stated that the public must serve as his “eyes and ears”. It is true. The DPP does not have the staff or resources to monitor all aspects of the LUO. They rely on legitimate complaints to initiate an investigation.

Anonymous complaints are taken but are much less likely to lead to enforcement. The reason is that the DPP received many spurious anonymous complaints from illegals and wasted much time investigating them – for nothing.

Many illegals have closed voluntarily – our very intention. More are cropping up and must be exposed and closed. When more have closed voluntarily, those remaining will be easier to identify and enforce against.

The best complaints are from close neighbors and more than one neighbor complaining. Facts are essential. SONHawaii will soon be issuing a ***‘guide to enforcement’***, based on the successes of the groups in Waianae, Kailua, Kahala and the North Shore.
